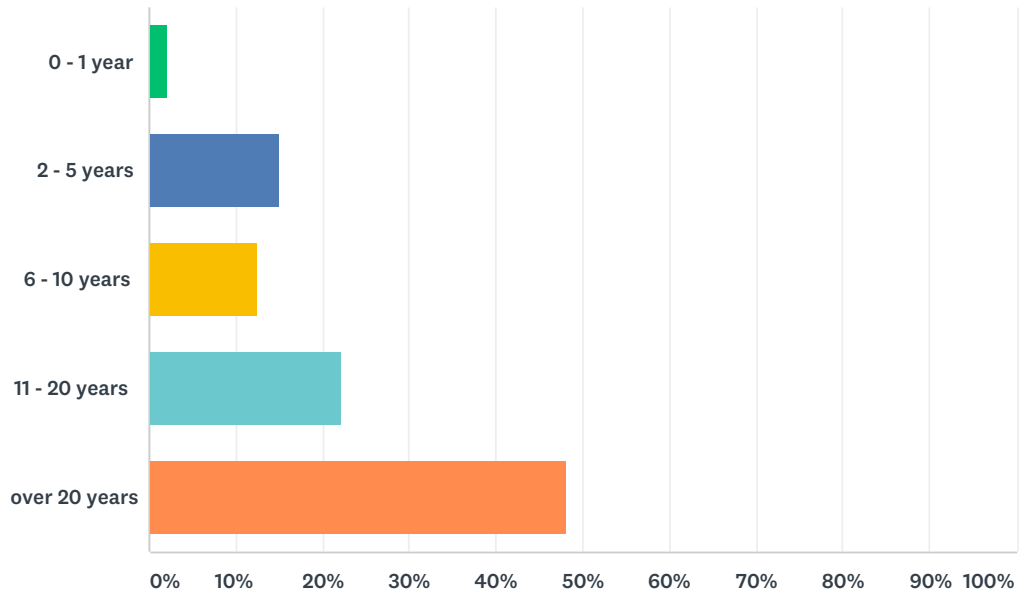

Q10 Background: During the 2017 budget process, the Council requested Staff to study refuse collection (garbage pickup) service. The Village Manager's office has been posting an operating loss for the Village's Refuse Fund, in part due to rising collection costs (labor, fleet, etc.) that have not been offset with corresponding increases in fees or property taxes. A recent analysis shows the Village annually spends ~\$480 per household for residential refuse and recycling services, which compares favorably with similar costs in neighboring municipalities. To potentially reduce costs, the Village may consider moving pick-up from back door to curbside, as is already the case for recycling and yard waste, the Village would provide standardized refuse containers. 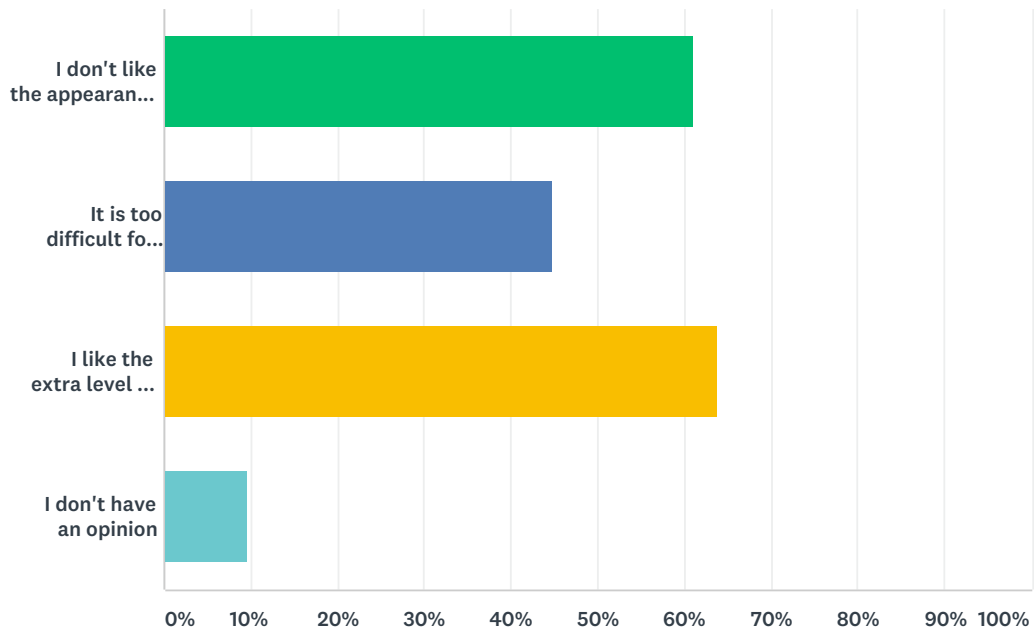

Q11 If you are opposed to the proposal to collect refuse from the curb, please check all of the reasons that apply.

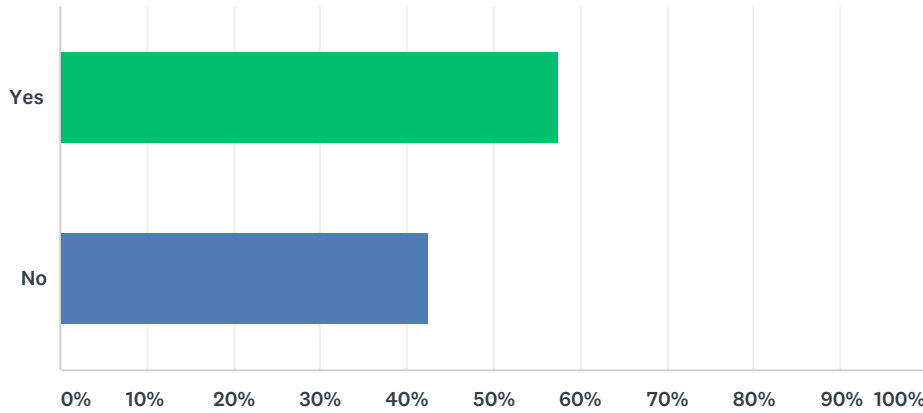

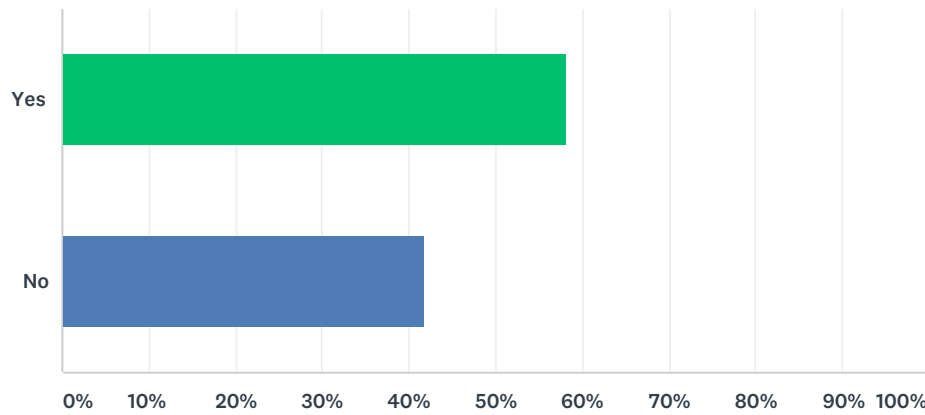

Q18 Has the internet become my public library?

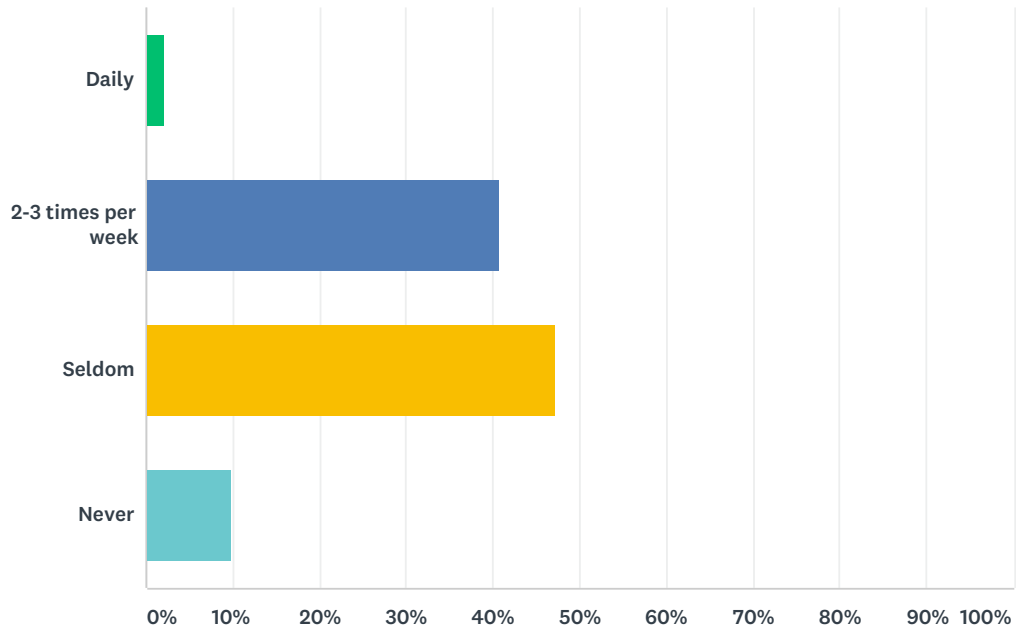

Q19 How often do you use the Winnetka and/or Northfield Public Library?

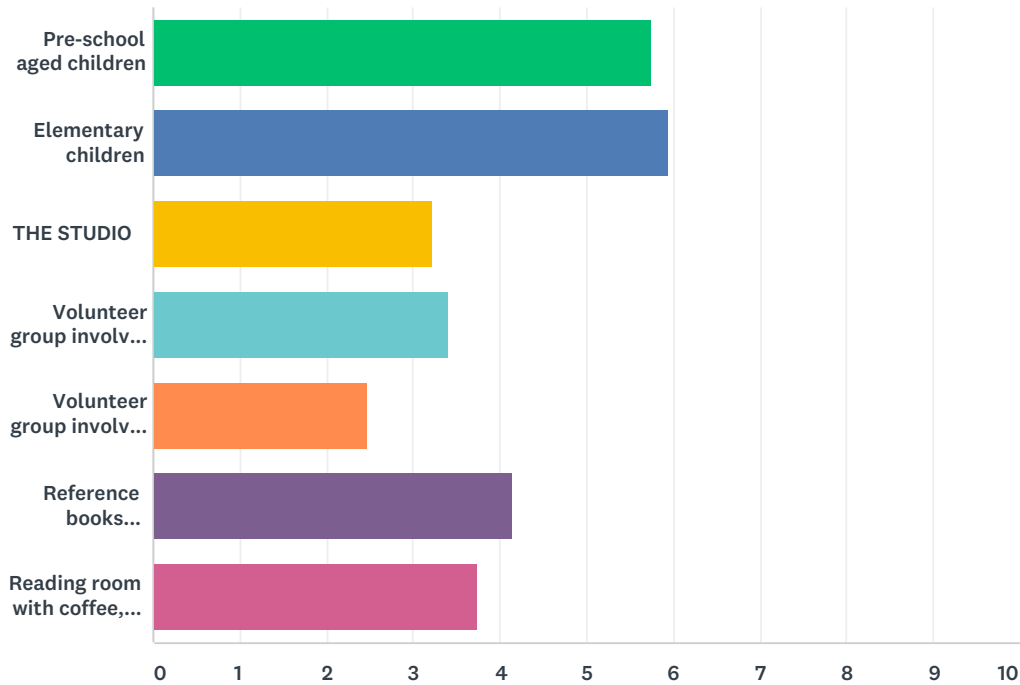

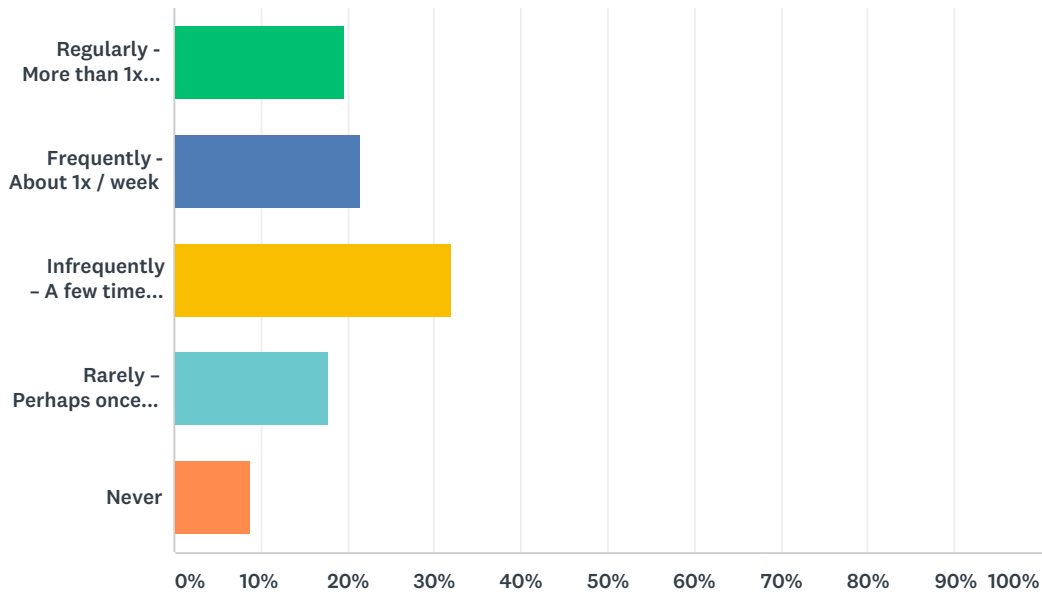

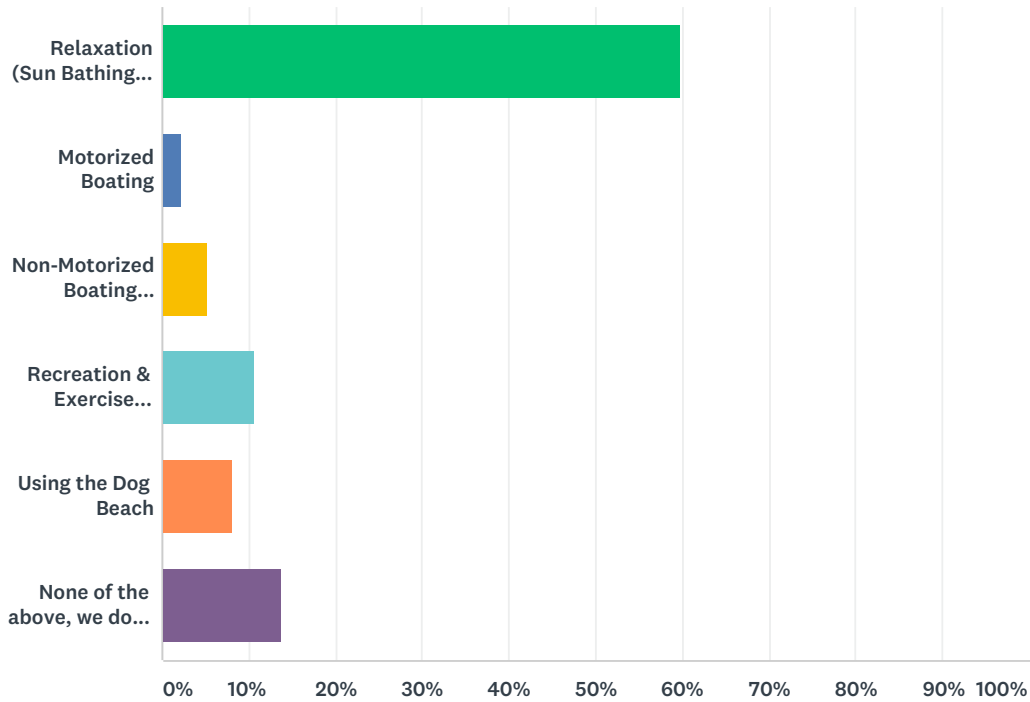

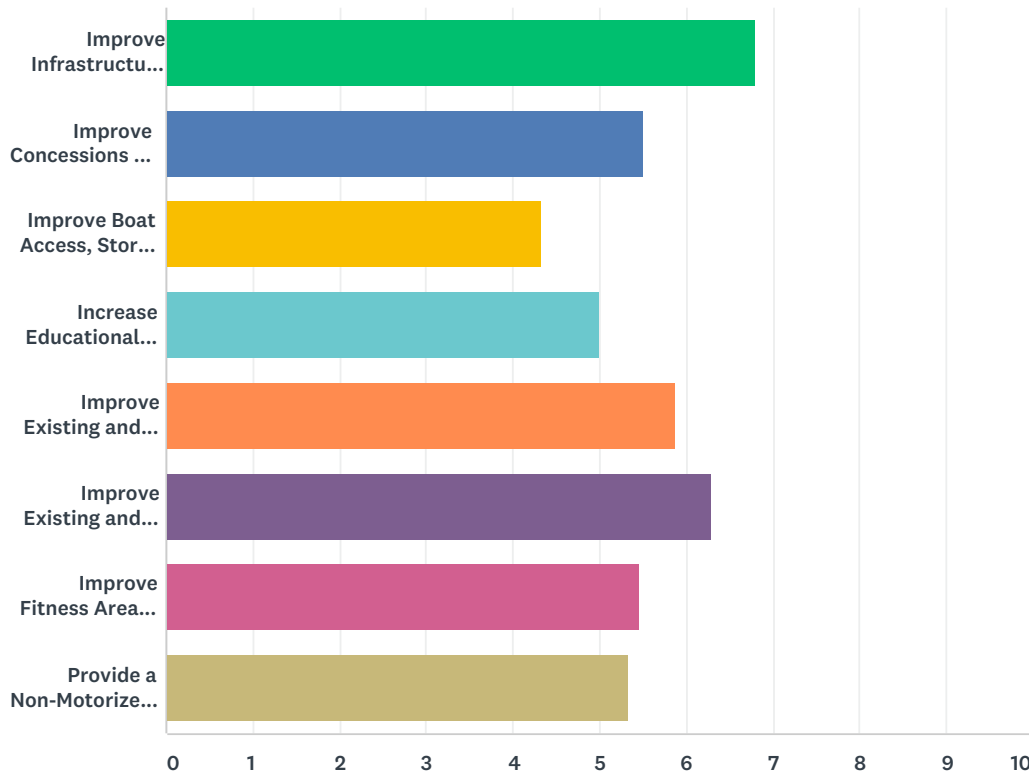

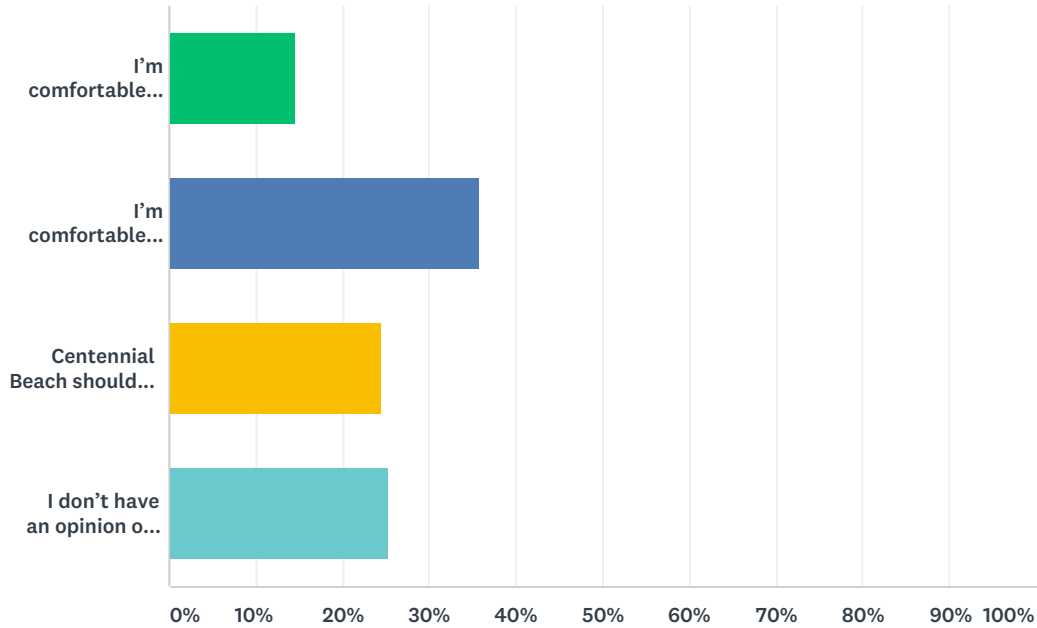

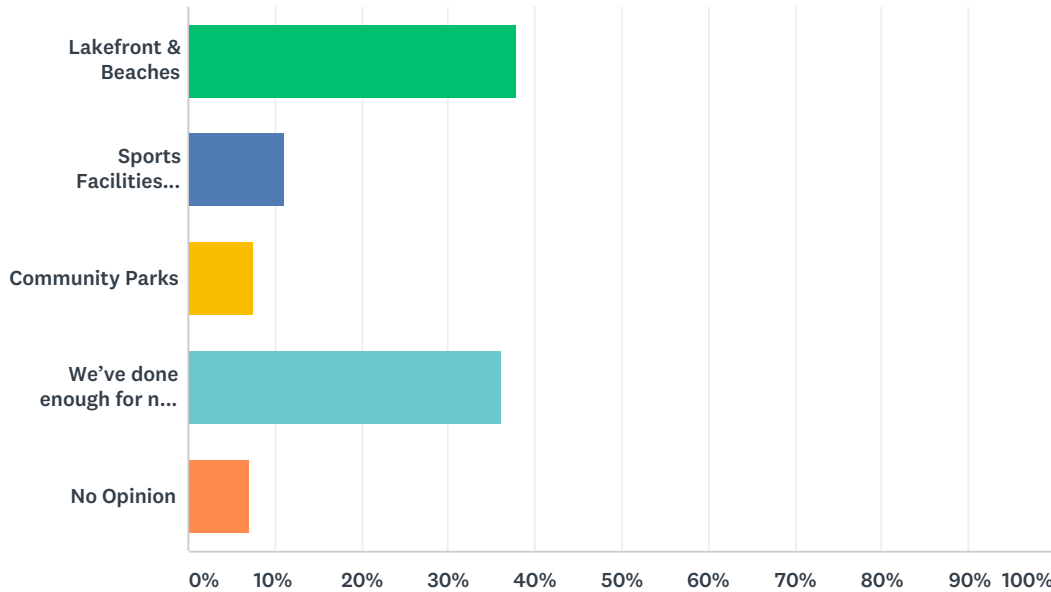

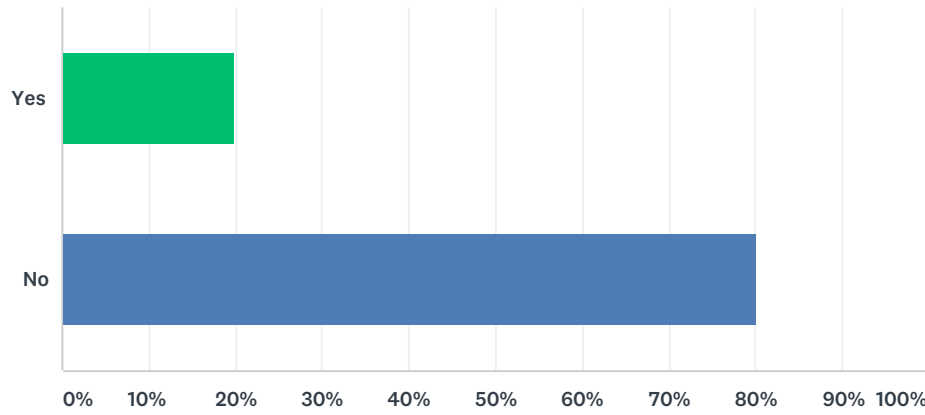

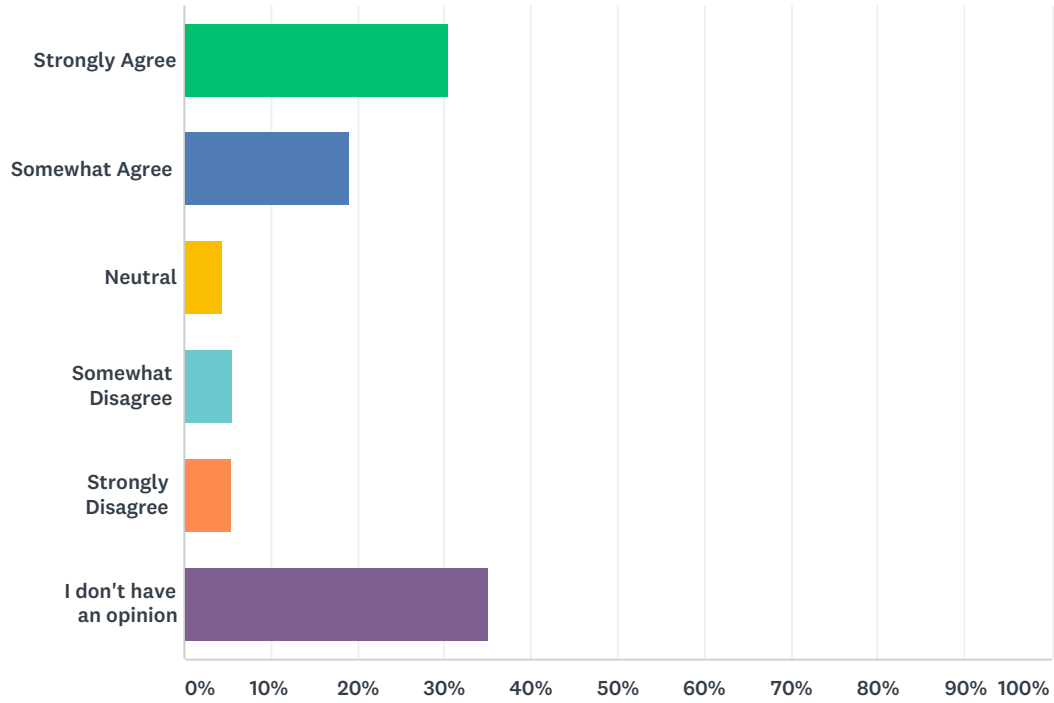

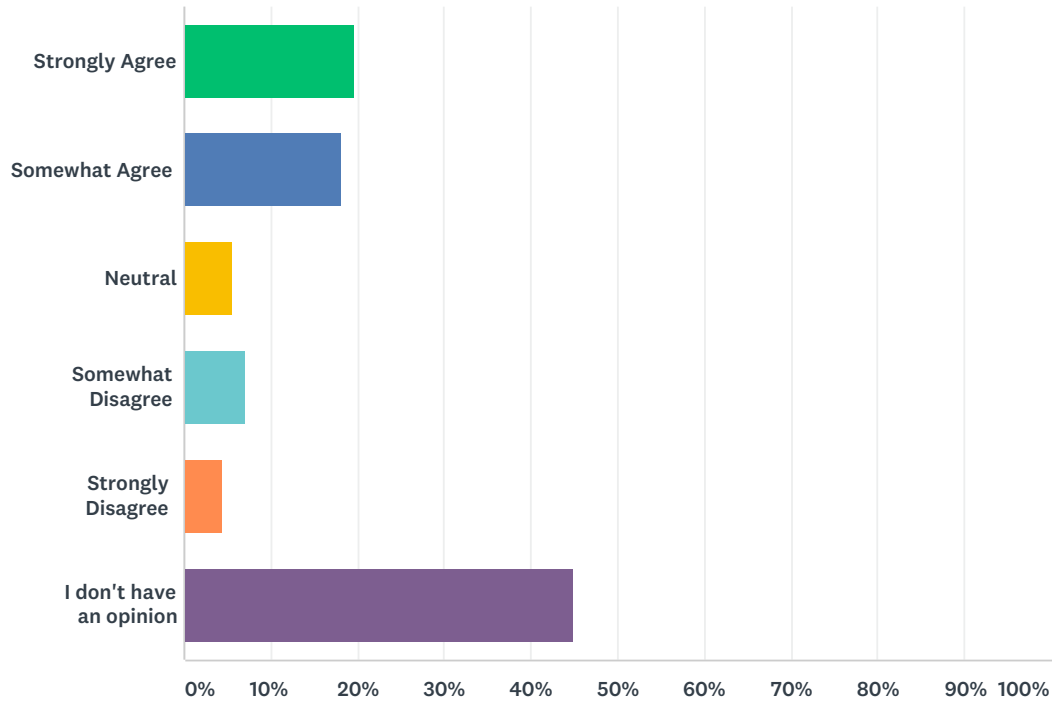

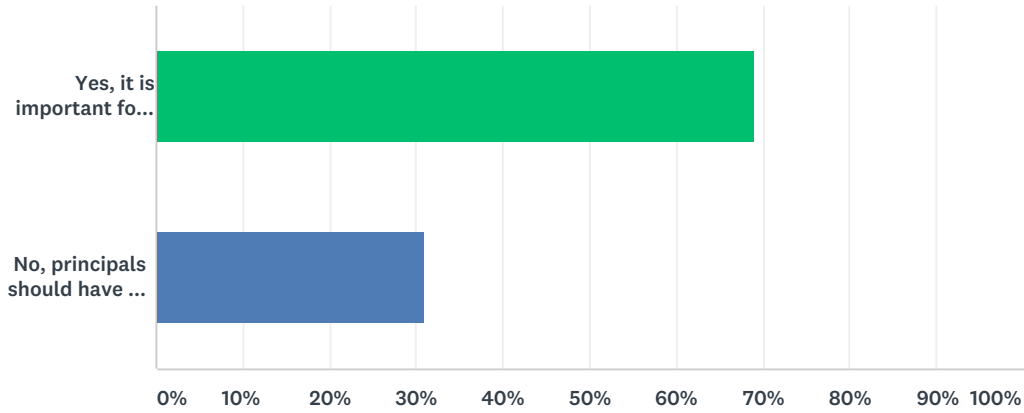

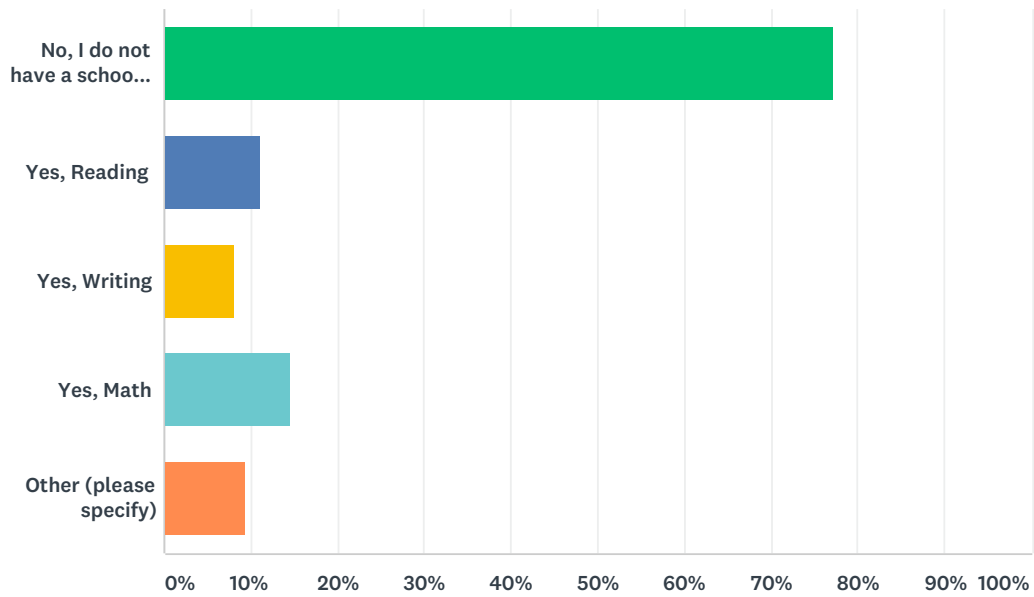

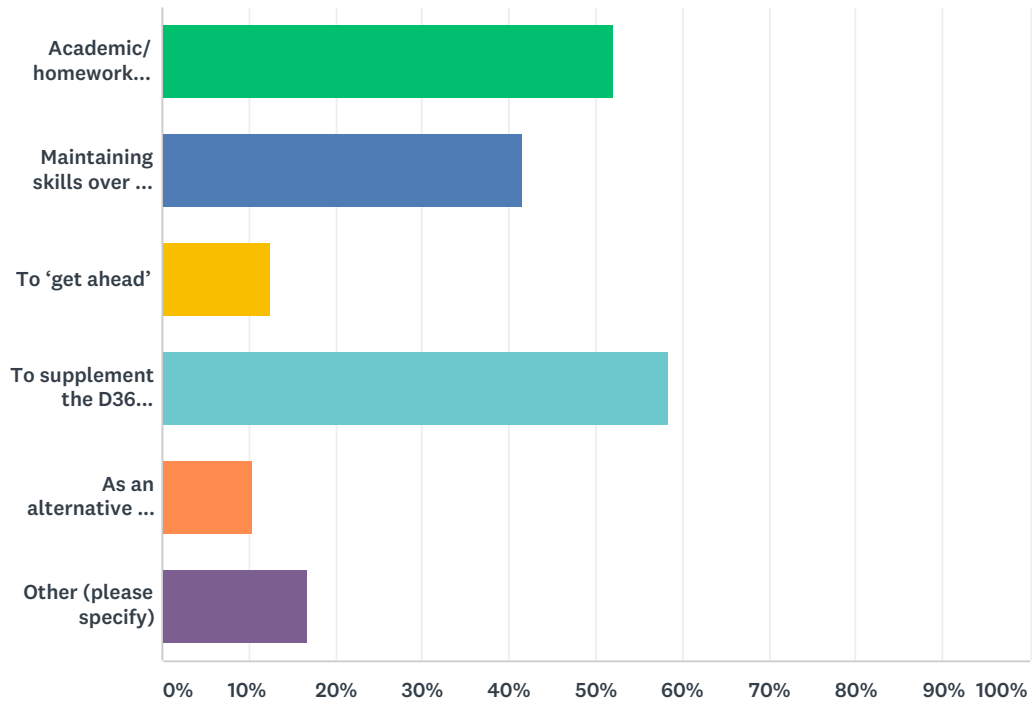

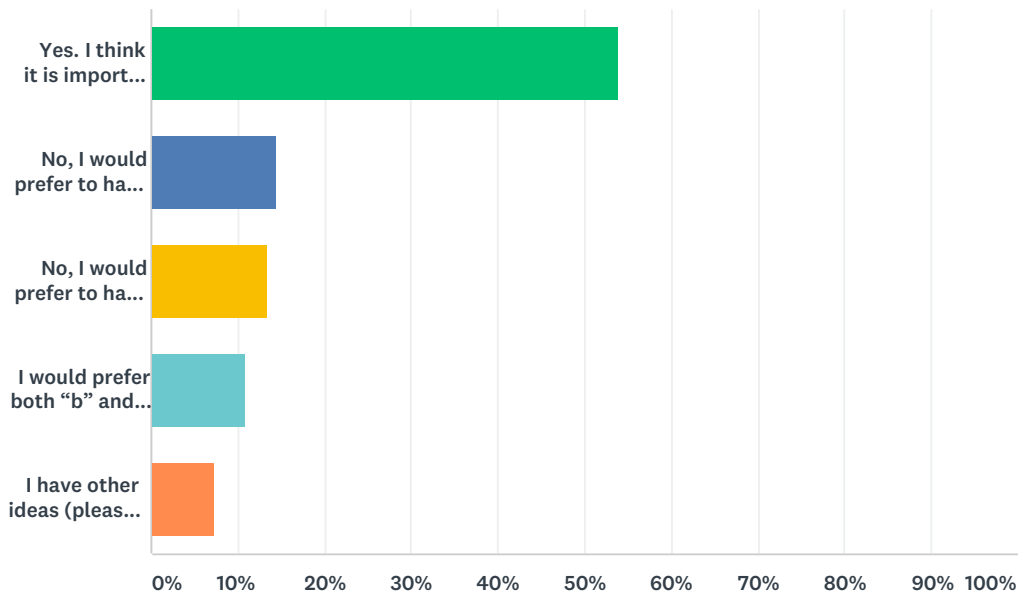

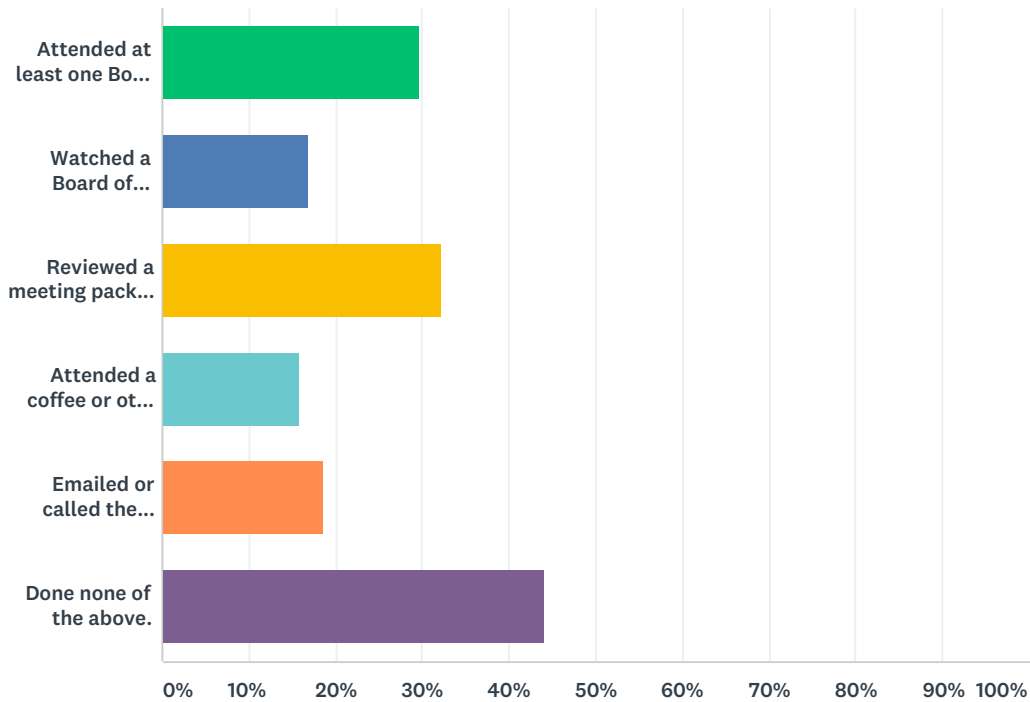

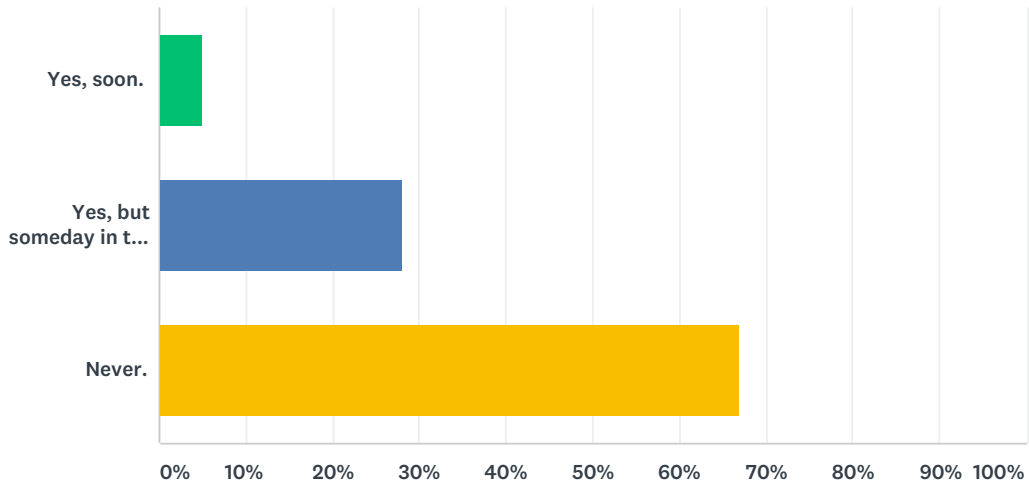

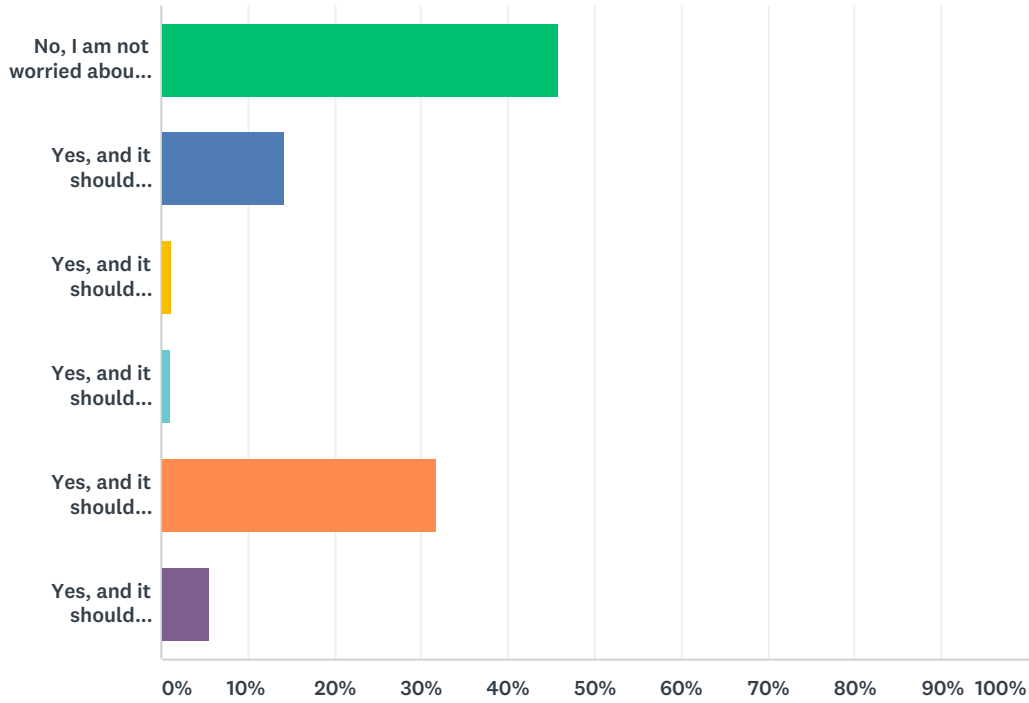

Q51 The village does not have a board or commission that is expressly focused on emergency preparedness or management. Do you think that a board or commission should focus on this issue?

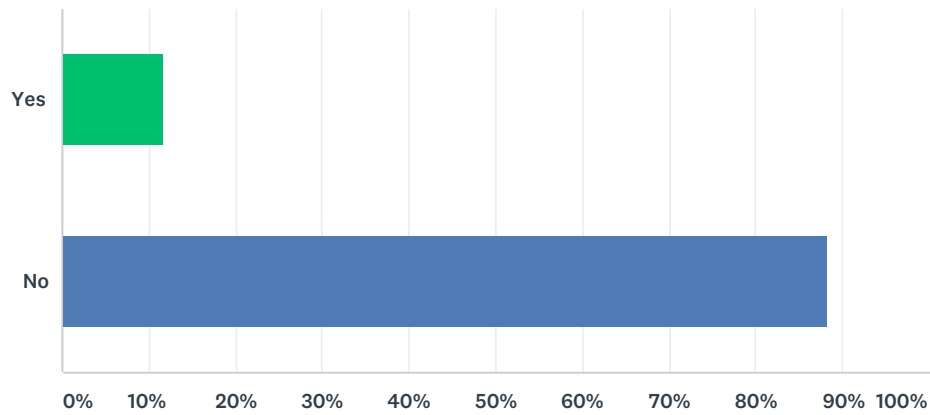
